Self-Help opening affordable rental complex in N. Visalia

elf-Help Enterprises is getting ready to officially open its first affordable rental community in north Visalia.


Highland Gardens, 2423 N. Highland St., has 36 two- and three-bedroom apartments with a half-court basketball court, playground, community center and community garden. Self-Help and the city will hold a ribbon-cutting ceremony and tour of the development at 9:30 a.m. Tuesday.

Self-Help, a community development organization that helps low-income families build and sustain healthy homes and communities, will coordinate health education events at the complex including Zumba, health prevention screenings and healthy cooking classes.

The community center will be used to conduct after-school programs, English-as-a-secondlanguage classes, and financial literacy workshops. A computer lab is open to adults and children for schoolwork and educational activities.

The development was constructed with green building features such as Energy Star appliances, a solar power system, water-conservation components and solar carports. It was also designed with walking in mind. The

In other Self-Help news, the agency has launched an improved homeownership education program called "The Gateway: Your Pathway to Homeownership."

Counselors will help families understand the different types of mortgage rates, the importance of credit scores, down payments and how much home is affordable. Families will receive a tailored action plan to help them achieve their homeownership goals.

The program is open to families in Fresno, Kern, Kings, Madera, Mariposa, Merced, Stanislaus and Tulare counties.

RENTERS PAY TOO MUCH

Fresno is No. 7 on a list of the 19 most cost-burdened cities nationwide for renters.

About 57.75 percent of Fresno renters spend more than 30 percent of their income on rent, according to ABODO .com, an online apartment website.


Two other California cities rank higher. The Riverside, San Bernardino and Ontario area is fourth with 58.7 percent of its renters struggling to pay rent. Los Angeles, Long Beach and Anaheim follow at 58.6 percent. Another six California cities round out the bottom 12.

At the top is Miami, Fort Lauderdale, and West Palm Beach in Florida with nearly 64 percent of its renters exceeding the 30 percent figure.

The Department of Housing and Urban Development considers families that pay more than 30 percent of their income on rent "cost burdened," which may lead to difficulties paying for other daily living necessities like food, clothing, transportation and medical

ABODO analyzed 100 metropolitan areas, using U.S. Census data, to see how renters in different cities with different incomes deal with housing costs. In almost every case, the majority of the cost-burdened renters made less than \$20,000.

In Fresno, 93.4 percent of the renters who make \$20,000 or less were cost burdened.
