

JANUARY

- Added the City of Sanger to our loan management portfolio
- Provided down payment assistance to our 2000th family



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FEBRUARY

 Closed on land purchase in Reedley for 67 self-help housing lots.





MARCH

- Launched the first-of-its-kind Rural Communities Water Managers Leadership Institute for community water board members and staff, water leaders, and residents from rural communities.
- Completed construction of phase 1 of Yettem and Seville's project to replace deteriorated water distribution system and improve water quality issues.

APRIL

- Broke ground on Annadale Commons
 -SHE's first senior affordable rental community in Fresno.
- Broke ground on our new single family subdivision in Planada.





 Awarded scholarships to 10 deserving students via the Doris Dooley
 Scholarship Fund - established to
 help the children of SHE's participant families further their education.

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JUNE

- Received over \$800,000 from the Governor's Office of Emergency Services to provide emergency preparedness training to Tulare County communities.
- Celebrated NeighborWorks Week and National Homeownership Month in Parksdale as 10 families moved into their new homes through SHE's Mutual Self-Help Housing Program.
- Adopted our new 5-year strategic plan





JULY

 Completed the Okieville-Highland Acres new water system, which will provide safe, reliable drinking water to 68 families.



AUGUST

- Acquired Eden House, in Visalia, which is being rehabilitated to serve people transitioning out of homelessness
- Received \$10 million in tax credits in partnership with the Tule River Indian Housing Authority, to construct Nupchi Xo' Oy, 40 units of affordable housing for tribal members in Porterville.





SEPTEMBER

- Awarded \$2.5 million to continue the placement of temporary water tanks for households that have lost their water supply.
- Opened doors to the newly built Stan Keasling Community Center at North Park Apartments in Oildale, allowing for expanded Resident Services.



OCTOBER

 Named the community center at Sierra Village rental community in Dinuba after beloved local advocate, and founding board member, Ralph Rosedale.

NOVEMBER

 Launched Míocar, a first-of-its-kind partnership providing an electric car sharing service to rural San Joaquin Valley residents.

DECEMBER

- Replaced 300th water well in response to the historic drought that began in 2014.
- Broke ground on legacy housing project in Patterson
- Provided down payment assistance to our 800th family in Tulare County
- Closed first RD 515 preservation deal -Mariposa Oaks
- Received Exemplary rating from NeighborWorks America
